Tonight I am going to explain a few ways the town can support autistic people and some things I have done to help educate the town's officers.

The first topic is how the town can improve summer camps to better support autistic kids. When possible it is very important to spread the kids out and not have too many kids in one space especially inside buildings because it can get too loud easily. It is important that all the staff receive some training on autism whether or not they are a special education camp counselor or not. This is important because the group counselors and directors still interact with the campers with disabilities so they need to understand the best way to interact with the kids and some of their needs.

It is important that all of the camp workers have training on basic methods of communication with kids with disabilities including non-speaking kids. The workers need to be taught to understand a variety of methods of non-speaking communication such as understanding facial expressions, physical direction, and pointing. The staff also need to be aware that some autistic kids may have slow processing and struggle to comprehend verbal information which may include directions for games or activities so it could be very beneficial to have directions written out. The camper should not be forced to participate in a large group activity that goes against their personality.

The next topic I am going to talk about is how the town can support autistic people in general. It could also be beneficial for the town board members to have specific days where people with disabilities can come and speak to them to learn more about the role of the board members and what the purpose of town government is and allow an opportunity for the people to ask any questions they may have. If anyone in the town meets someone who is autistic make them feel accepted, respect them, don't underestimate them and include them. If the town ever has the opportunity to build more affordable housing that is so important because that will allow more people with disabilities to be able to live in our town. It's so important to create more housing programs in our towns because people with disabilities who grew up living in our town should not be forced to move to a different area or city as adults if they want to live independently because there are not enough housing support programs.

The final topic I will talk about is the work I have been doing to educate the Town of Manlius police officers about autism. I'm passionate about this topic because I have a good relationship with many of the local officers and I believe its so important to provide them with accurate non ableist information because it's wrong to get frustrated at police for doing something wrong if they never had an appropriate amount of training so that's why I believe it's good for community members who want to educate the officers about some topic to create the information or find the resources and send it to the police department or email it to the officers. For about a year I have been providing the police department a variety of resources about autism such as some general information and

things about myself as an autistic woman. I have also made them information sheets and a PowerPoint about autism and the officers have been very open to learning more about autism and I believe they understand why it's important to learn about autism more extensively since many autistic people interact with law enforcement. Some of the topics included in my PowerPoint was general information about autism, information about autism and crime, information about sensory overload and how police can reduce sensory overload, types of stimming, explanation of why eye contact can be hard for some autistic people, suicide/ mental illness signs related to autism, how to communicate with autistic people and explaining how many autistic people have slow processing. It is a good first step to have the officers read the information I made in my PowerPoint but my hope is to eventually create an event/ day that is specifically for people with disabilities to interact with police officers, ask any questions, learn about some police related topics, and practice some police related things. A county police department in Maryland called the Montgomery county department of police created a very successful and effective autism/ intellectual and developmental disabilities and Alzheimer's outreach program so many of my ideas for our town's police department come from reading/ listening about their program. I also plan to raise money to be able to provide sensory toys for each police car so that if they need to interact or transport an autistic person for any reason then the process could go better if the autistic person can choose a toy to play with to keep them busy and help to regulate their emotions or sensory stuff.

The following resolution was moved, seconded and adopted:

WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, municipal public bodies were authorized by Executive Order to meet virtually to conduct business;

WHEREAS, the State Legislature passed and the Governor signed legislation that amends Public Officers Law Section 103-a and allows municipalities to continue to hold virtual meetings under certain circumstances;

WHEREAS, the Town of Manlius has used virtual meetings extensively over the past several years and the Town Board has invested resources, time and energy to make the virtual meeting platform easy to use and accessible to Board members and the public;

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to continue to use virtual meetings to conduct business;

WHEREAS, a Local Law has been introduced before the Board, to wit: Local Law No. 2022- ____, creating Chapter 29 of the Town Code entitled “Town Board” as follows:

**LOCAL LAW 2022-____, A LOCAL LAW CREATING
CHAPTER 29 ENTITLED “TOWN BOARD POLICIES”
THAT IMPLEMENTS VARIOUS TOWN POLICIES AND
PROCEDURES FOR TOWN PUBLIC BODIES:**

**Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Manlius, Onondaga County,
New York as follows:**

Chapter 29

TOWN BOARD POLICIES

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to give the town’s public bodies (as that term is defined in Public Officers Law Section 102) the authority to participate in meetings via videoconferencing in a manner consistent with the town’s videoconferencing policy and the authority granted in Public Officers Law Section 103-a.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to Public Officer’s Law Section 103-a which expressly authorizes the town board to adopt a local law giving the town public bodies the authority to participate in meetings via videoconference from locations not accessible to the public so long as

a quorum of the public body participates from locations where the public may be physically present and other conditions are met.

Section 3. Videoconferencing for Public Meetings

The Town Board of the Town of Manlius hereby authorizes all members of the town's public bodies to participate in meetings using videoconferencing technology in a manner consistent with Public Officers Law Section 103-a and the town's videoconferencing policy adopted by the Town Board.

Section 4. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstances, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgement shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, the Town Board held a public hearing on Local Law 2022-__ on June 8, 2022 at which time the public was given an opportunity to speak for and against said Local Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Local Law 2022-__ as set forth above is hereby adopted by the Town Board for the reasons stated in this resolution; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Town of Manlius file Local Law 2022-__ with the Secretary of State within 20 days of its adoption.

TOWN OF MANLIUS
VIDOECONFERENCING POLICY AND GUIDELINES

Adopted _____, 2022

Pursuant to Local Law 2022-____, the Town Board of the Town of Manlius supports and encourages the option of videoconferencing for all its public bodies, as that term is defined in Section 102 of the Public Officers Law.

The following meeting policies are hereby adopted by the Town Board:

1. A quorum of any public body must meet in a location that is accessible to the public before any other member can participate by videoconferencing.
2. Videoconference board participants shall always use the video function.
3. Videoconference board participants shall be in a well-lit room, so their face is clearly visible, sitting close enough to the microphone to be heard, and use their real full name in the “name” box.
4. The following justifications are acceptable reasons to participate by videoconferencing:
 - a. Illness;
 - b. Caregiving responsibilities;
 - c. Disability;
 - d. Out of town business obligations;
 - e. Other extraordinary circumstances as determined by a majority vote of the public body.
5. Minutes of the meeting must include who participated via videoconferencing;
6. If a member of a public body participates by videoconferencing, the public must also be allowed to participate via videoconferencing the same as they would be able to if attending in person.
7. A copy of this Policy shall be posted on the Town Website.
8. Other Open Meeting Law requirements including those regarding the posting of meeting notices, keeping of minutes, identifying, and maintaining documents used at the meeting, and going into executive session continue to apply.
9. The Town of Manlius Rules of Decorum shall apply to all participants, whether in person or by videoconferencing.

TOWN OF MANLIUS BUS LEASE – SUMMER PROGRAM AGREEMENT

This agreement between the Fayetteville-Manlius Central School District hereinafter called the “District” and the Town of Manlius Recreation Department, hereafter called “Town”, is made pursuant to Section 1502 of the Educational Law.

1. The “District” agrees to lease to the “Town” one (1) sixty (60) passenger school buses for the period of July 5 – August 12, 2022 and an additional bus for August 9 and 10, 2022.
2. “District” bus drivers will receive first consideration by the “Town” for summer driving employment.
3. The “District” Transportation Supervisor’s approval of the driver’s qualifications will be required.
4. The “Town” will pay any and all expenses incurred in operation of the bus including fuel, driver salaries, etc.
5. The “Town” will pay the district a fee of \$200.00 for use of the bus under the terms of this agreement.
6. The “Town” furnish to the “District” Certificate of Insurance in such form as the “District” may require. Such insurance coverage will be in the same limits that the “District” coverage included.
7. The “Town” will be fully responsible for all physical damage to the bus.
8. The “Town” agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the “District” harmless, from and against any and all claims, losses, liabilities or expense, including attorney fees and costs arising out of or resulting from the use by the “Town” of the buses leased hereunder.
