Member Pilewski asked the committee for their thoughts on pop up cannabis dispensaries. Discussion ensued amongst the committee.

The committee requested more information from the Chief on how the department is handling the new cannabis laws and the pop-up dispensaries.

The committee also requested that the chief provide the committee with a staffing report.

Councilor Nicholson stated that SMTC has identified an area that includes all three villages for a pedestrian and cycling study. The committee discussed the benefits of including the department in that study. Further discussion ensued regarding traffic safety and speeding.

Member Pilewski asked for more information on how he could find the monthly reports created by TMPD.

5. Police Chief Report –Chief Jason Cassalia

Chief Cassalia submitted the following report to the committee:

- “Shop with a Cop” was held on Saturday, December 2nd. Members of the TMPD PBA, Administrative Staff, Town Hall Staff, Fayetteville Fire / EMS, local school districts and more participated to make this another wonderful year. Kids arrived, had breakfast, worked on crafts, then were paired for their shopping experience at Target with a TMPD member(s). Later they returned and all the gifts were wrapped by our volunteers, and they were treated to a lunch from Carrabba’s. A wonderful morning for all involved!
- Turkey Baskets were also another big hit this year. The PBA did a fantastic job ensuring local food banks received 160 dinners for local families for Thanksgiving.
- The agency has had significant criminal activity surrounding thefts of property from vehicles and the thefts of vehicles also. The agency has solved a considerable number of these crimes, identifying juveniles that have been involved in those thefts to include police pursuits and other criminal activity within the Town of Manlius and also within the City of Syracuse and Onondaga County.
- Chief Cassalia has been asked to speak at the Annual Meeting for the Onondaga East Chamber on January 11th at 5:30 – 8:30PM at the Calvary Club.
- The department is formulating the organizations 2024 Goals and Objectives that will frame the intent of the agency focus for the coming year. As the department builds these goals, we are paying significant attention to the comprehensive plan of the Town of Manlius, and the direction and needs of the Villages of Fayetteville, Manlius and Minoa. Conversations are ongoing.
- The department’s newest Police Officer selection, Luke Rufo, started the academy December 7th in Monroe County.

- The department has started the selection process again and are canvassing for the position of police officer with the intent to hire for a spring 2024 academy.
