Ben Levy of Manlius spoke in favor of the proposed sidewalk district. Mr. Levy also inquired about the previous attempt for a sidewalk district. Supervisor Deer gave credit to Elaine Denton and Monica Browning for taking a different approach with this attempt.

Nicki Bissen of Manlius spoke in favor of the proposed district. Ms. Bissen also spoke regarding the unsafe conditions while walking on Enders Road and how it was unsafe for students walking to school.

Harper of Manlius spoke on how other students say they are scared to walk to school. Harper also stated that the sidewalk will shorten the walk for students.

Bethany Bach of Manlius voiced her concern for the safety of students when walking to school with limited visibility and speeding traffic.

Tom Bassett of Manlius supports the proposed district. Mr. Bassett inquired about potential easement issues.

Barbara Conklin of Manlius stated when walking her dog there is nowhere for her to go. Ms. Conklin was pleased that maintenance was included in the district.

Kevin Murphy of Manlius does not agree with the proposal. Made a suggestion of putting a crossing guard at Glen Eagle. Mr. Murphy did not agree with the way the district was determined.

Chris Rudio of Manlius voiced concern with the location of the sidewalk at Enders Rd and Route 92 from the High School. Ms. Rudio is concerned for the safety of the students walking and having to cross the street.

Mary Ward of Manlius spoke regarding an incident where her daughter was grazed by a vehicle on way to the high school. Ms. Ward agreed that area needed to be improved.

Councilor Italiano made a motion, seconded by Councilor Kriesel, to accept the annual

procedures review of the Justice Court for the years 2019-2023 completed by F.J. Pompo and Company, PC as required by the Uniform Justice Court Act.
