

Recreation Summer Staff Approval

Councilor Green presented the 2018 summer roster of recreation and swim staff employees to the Town Board.

FM School Bus Contract

Councilor Green made a motion, seconded by Councilor Marzola, to authorize the Town of Manlius Recreation Department to enter into an agreement with the Fayetteville-Manlius Central School District to lease a sixty-passenger school bus from July 2, 2018 to August 22, 2018 for the summer recreation program.

Supervisor Theobald stated that crossing guards work in any weather condition to keep our school children safe as they walk to and from school.

Correspondence/New Business

A) Highway Superintendent

Highway Superintendent Cushing stated that OCWA has requested a highway permit to extend a water main at Mallards Landing, Section 9 Muscovy Lane.

Councilor Rossetti made a motion, seconded by Councilor Marzola, to authorize the Supervisor to sign a highway permit for OCWA to install an 8" extension of the water main at Mallards Landing, Sec. 9 (Muscovy Lane).

Highway Superintendent Cushing presented a request from Windstream for a highway permit to work within the town's right of way to install two structures to enhance the wireless internet in the Enders Road and Glen Eagle neighborhood area. Windstream

would like to install a pole with a device and pedestal style device at three locations along Enders Road.

Conversation ensued regarding what type of apparatus would be installed.

The Town Board requested a presentation from the applicant and any current site where the apparatus is installed.

B) Planning & Development

Director Capriotti stated that planning and development is very busy with complaints and inspections.

E) Police Chief

Chief Crowell stated that the Raise the Age Legislation will begin to be implemented soon and the department is preparing to meet the requirements.

Chief Crowell stated that preparations for the Fourth of July Parade in the Village of Manlius have been finalized.

Chief Crowell stated that calls for service have risen by 22%. Conversation ensued regarding how calls for service are counted and what may be the possible cause for the increase.

F) Town Board

Councilor Bollinger stated that she attended a Manlius Informed lecture by Kevin Schwab on local government modernization. Councilor Bollinger also attended a presentation by the Division of Local Government Services for the Local Government Efficiency Grant program and a webinar from the State Comptrollers Office on Open Book NY.

Councilor Green stated that the police committee met with the new police officer recruits.

Councilor Rossetti stated that he and Councilor Loeffler have completed their analysis on the cost to provide a SIRO (School Information Resource Officer) to the school districts. Councilor Rossetti stated that he will be meeting with the school districts to discuss the matter.

Councilor Rossetti stated that the East Syracuse Minoa School District has approved the 2018 SIRO contracts with the updated cost schedule for Officer Rebecca Kammar and Officer Brian Damon.

Councilor Giordano made a motion, seconded by Councilor Green, to authorize Supervisor Theobald and Chief Crowell to sign the 2018 contract with the East Syracuse Minoa School District for the School Information Resource Officer position for Officer Kammar.

Pierson Road – Large Truck Traffic

Supervisor Theobald stated that he has received a request from a resident on Pierson Road asking for relief from excessive dump truck traffic. Supervisor Theobald also presented a petition from 19 people along Pierson Road and George Taylor Road requesting relief from speeders and excessive large truck traffic.

Supervisor Theobald and Highway Superintendent Cushing met with representatives from Kinsella Quarry and the large truck traffic from Kinsella Quarry will be re-routed from Pierson Road.

Councilor Rosetti asked if George Taylor Road would need to be posted as well? Highway Superintendent Cushing stated that George Taylor Road would need to be posted as well.

Highway Superintendent Cushing stated that Kinsella Quarry trucks will take Mycenae Road.

Discussion ensued regarding the posted speed limit on Pierson Road and George Taylor Road.

Councilor Green discussed the large truck traffic complaints from Enders Road residents as well. Highway Superintendent Cushing stated that is the only major roadway to cut through Route 92 and Route 173. Highway Superintendent Cushing stated that the town is required by law to provide an adequate route, within reason, for large trucks through the town.

Councilor Bollinger discussed the Route 5 traffic study and how speed related to fuel usage.

Chief Crowell reviewed the results of the traffic study on Pierson Road and Duguid Road. Chief Crowell stated that Duguid Road was reviewed for comparison purposes and there is a greater amount of large truck traffic on Pierson Road.

Councilor Marzola asked if the large truck traffic on Pierson Road would be greatly reduced now that the trucks from Kinsella Quarry are taking different routes.
